Taoism: The Basics

Background Info

- 1. Is an ancient Chinese philosophy & religion
- 2. Stresses balance-- living simply and honestly and in harmony with nature.
- 3. Similar to Buddhism, Taoists believe that we should be more concerned with life on Earth, and they do not worry about the aferlife. They do strive to achieve "Emptiness", which allows them to achieve true awareness/enlightenment.
- 4. Believe that how you live impacts how respected an ancestor spirit you'll be after you die.
- 5. Pronounced "Dowism"

Major Concepts of Taoism, as Explained by Winnie the Pooh

Naturalness basically means to balance your inner self (thoughts and feelings) with nature. Taoists try to behave simply and instinctively, as nature does, which will allow you to achieve what they call "Emptiness" (enlightenment).

The problem is when humans let their thoughts, ambitions, etc. get in the way of following naturalness and let themselves get stuck in the world of mankind. It throws them off balance, and they can no longer balance their inner selves with nature.

Wu Wei
